KEY MESSAGES TO SMEs ABOUT THE SEAL

SMEs usually welcome the seal, understand its value and were asking for it. Expectations have to be managed:

- > A great opportunity, but process just starting: be patient!
- > No guarantee of 'automatic' alternative funding and/or to the funding intensity of H2020 / No to be used for DOUBLE FUNDING
- > <u>Search pro-actively</u>: only you (SMEs) receive the seal and can use it....
- > ...if you wish so (no obligation!)
- > <u>Make available to the funder ALL documents at your disposal</u> (Full Proposal, Evaluation Summary Report,...)
- > <u>DIVERSIFY your search for funding</u>, in terms of sources (public (ESIF or own resources) / private) and type (grants / financial instruments)





KEY MESSAGES TO ALTERNATIVE FUNDING SOURCES

(ie: Managing authorities, nat/reg agencies, private foundations, banks, VCs, bus.angels)

- > <u>SoE are excellent projects</u>, not left-overs from Horizon 2020 (strict criteria, international panel, transparent and competitive evaluation)
- > Great opportunity to exploit H2020 first-class evaluation system: leading to gain time, use resources efficiently in a period of scarce resources and increase **R&I** performance and impact at local level
- > Keep the process as simple as possible: no need to re-evaluate the content
- > <u>Different support can be provided</u>: grants/loans/guarantee/... general support
- > <u>'Seal'- under-performing MSs</u>: consider the learning curve!
- > The Commission services support funding bodies interested in taking up these projects, through the **COMMUNITY OF PRACTICE** and promoting relevant 9 schemes!



The COMMUNITY OF PRACTICE (CoP):

Commission

- ✓ Purpose: Exchange of know-how on the best ways to implement the 'seal of excellence' approach through ESIF
- ✓ Creation: by the Commission since July 2015 following the presentation of the 'seal' concept at EGESIF meeting
- ✓ Membership: on voluntary basis, restricted to National or Regional authorities that have a funding power and other Funding Agencies for Innovating SMEs (including private banks and investors) committing to set up 'seal-friendly' schemes
- ✓ Working Methods: Regular meetings + IT platform SINAPSE

SPAIN

Since 2015, Spanish companies that have scored 12 or more on the SME instrument phase 1 mbardy Region are encouraged to apply under a SME can bid in the call, "Horizonte PYME", issued by the Spanish Ministry of Economy and the same SME Instrument - Horizon 2020 proposal and Competitiveness with the Spanish Innovation Agency.

The grants allow the SMEs to conduct the full SME instrument phase 1 based on the de minimis regime. SMEs have the possibility to request the help of a business coach. The call had a budget of 8.6 M€. Since its opening, the call has attracted a very positive response from the SME community. More than 220 SMEs presented the proposal in the two weeks following the call opening in July 2015. Out of those 220 SMEs, 135 SMEs were selected for funding. By the end of 2015, all the SME's selected received their pre-financing



This quality label is awarded to project proposals submitted for funding under Horizon 2020, which succeeded in passing all of the stringent selection and award criteria but could not be funded under the available Call budget. The 'Seal' identifies project proposals which merit funding from alternative sources public or private, national, regional, European or international.

Why?

Not all the good proposals get funded in Horizon2020. The SEAL will benefit:

- . SMEs: get a 2nd chance to get funding
- · Regions: identify and support high quality proposals with a clear territorial impact

How?

The action concerns, for this initial 'pilot' phase, only proposals applying for the SME instrument and in particular all those SME instrument proposals evaluated above the quality threshold.

The Commissioner will announce, jointly with Commissioner Creţu, the launch of the 'Seal of Excellence' for proposals under the 'SME Instrument', at the opening session of the 13th edition of the OPEN DAYS - European Week of Regions and Cities.

Commissioner Moedas will also announce the establishment of a 'Knowledge Exchange Platform' (KEP), jointly set by DG Research and Innovation and the Committee of the Regions. The objectives of the KEP are to set up learning mechanism for regions and cities on research and innovation activities, valorise new knowledge created through Horizon 2020 projects and maximise synergies between Horizon 2020 and the European Structural and Investment Funds

In a period of scarce resources, the impact of our investments in Research and Innovation needs to be maximised: creating synergies between Horizon 2020 and other funding sources (such as, but not exclusively, the European Structural and Investment Funds (ESIF)) is a way to achieve it.

«We fully support the 'Seal of Excellence' as an important first step in a longer term process of building synergies between Horizon 2020 and the European Structural and Investment Funds. It will help innovative companies to access and enhance the knowledge economy in their regions, contributing therefore to the implementation of smart specialisation strategies»

Why a 'Seal of Excellence'?

Every year, thousands of organisations in Europe apply to the Horizon 2020 Programme investing precious resources and time. The European Commission runs one of the most complete evaluation systems in the world, using international independent experts. The evaluation screens against three defined criteria (excellence, impact and quality & efficiency of implementation) and identifies those proposals not mature enough to receive funding (below quality threshold) and those that are considered as meriting funding (above threshold). Only some of the above threshold proposals receive funding depending on the available Horizon 2020 budget.

The 'Seal of Excellence' certificate will be awarded to the applicants of above threshold not funded proposals: a holder of the certificate can then approach alternative funding sources (regional, national, private or public) and present the certificate as a label of a high-quality project proposal. Thanks to the 'Seal', high quality proposals from innovative Small and Medium Enterprises will have additional chances to be funded. The precious time and effort SMEs invested in the proposal and idea development will thus not be wasted.

The 'Seal of Excellence' offers at the same time a unique opportunity for regions and Member States (and any other interested actor) to fully exploit the high-quality Horizon 2020 evaluation process: to easily identify and possibly support high-impact proposals coming from promising innovative companies, with an ambition to grow and compete internationally
